#### 1. COLLECTIVE ORDER

This collective order is to allow nurses and medical technologists to administer sucrose 24% in infants less than 1 year old to control pain related to minor short procedures as described below.

## 2. ENTITLED TO

Nurses, Medical Technologist who have obtain their certificate form l'Ordre professionnel des technologistes médicaux du Québec.

#### 3. RESERVED ACTS

This collective order allows the previously mentioned individuals to administer sucrose 24 % as per the clinical procedure Administration of Sucrose 24% in Pediatric Population and considering indications and contraindications mentioned below.

Technologistes médicaux du Québec

Art 37.1, 6 (d) Professional Code:

Administer, including intravenously from a peripheral site, prescribed medications or other prescribed substances, provided a training certificate has been issued to the member by the Order pursuant to a regulation under paragraph 0 of section 94.

### Nurses

Art 36, Nurses Act:

Initiate diagnostic and therapeutic measures, according to a prescription;

Administering and adjusting prescribed medications or other prescribed substances.

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#### 4. INDICATIONS - TARGETED GROUPS OR TARGETED CLINICAL SITUATION

- Analgesia or co-analgesia for short procedural pain (not exhaustive list)
  - ✓ Needle procedure
  - ✓ PICC line insertion
  - ✓ Urinary catheter insertion
  - ✓ Lumbar puncture
  - ✓ Arterial puncture
  - √ Retinopathy of prematurity exam
  - ✓ NG tube insertion
  - ✓ Dressing changes, tape removal
  - ✓ Rectal irrigation
  - ✓ Mobilization and/or manipulations that may cause pain.

## Use for irritability is NOT an indication

#### 5. CONTRAINDICATIONS

- o Necrotizing enterocolitis
- Short bowel syndrome with carbohydrate intolerance
- o Inborn error of metabolism
- o Unrepaired tracheal esophageal fistula or atresia
- o Known fructose or sucrose intolerance
- o Absence of gag reflex (heavy sedation, neurologic impairment)
