



Indications

- The Comfort Zone is a bundle of four strategies that have been shown to decrease pain and distress associated with needle procedures when used together:
 - Comfort positioning (kangaroo care, bundling for those up to 6 months of age, or facilitated tucking in the premature infant that cannot be bundled)
 - Direct breastfeeding or sucrose administration (**Note: breastmilk alone, without the skin to skin contact, does NOT act as a replacement for sucrose)
 - Distraction (Eg. pacifier, music, talking to baby gently, patting or stroking baby)
 - Topical anesthetic (Lidocaine 4% cream)

Key points

- All needle procedures are included, but indications for each strategy may differ depending on procedure (see table below).
- Contraindications for lidocaine 4% include allergy to lidocaine and urgent procedure (eg. Stat IV)

Procedure	Recommended Pain Management
Heel Prick	 Breastfeeding OR pacifier + sucrose 24% Comfort positioning Distraction
Injection (SC or IM)	 Topical anesthetic (lidocaine 4%), covered with Tegaderm, 20-30 minutes prior to procedure start (refer to lexicomp or Lidocaine protocol for dosing) Breastfeeding OR pacifier + sucrose 24% Comfort positioning Distraction
Lumbar Puncture	 Topical anesthetic (lidocaine 4%), covered with Tegaderm, 20-30 minutes prior to procedure start (refer to Lexicomp or Lidocaine protocol for dosing) Breastfeeding OR pacifier + sucrose 24% Distraction
Venipuncture/ IV insertion	 Topical anesthetic (lidocaine 4%), covered with Tegaderm, 20-30 minutes prior to procedure start (refer to Lexicomp or Lidocaine protocol for dosing) Breastfeeding OR pacifier + sucrose 24% Comfort positioning (swaddling) Distraction
